After 1920, some people listened to the radio.

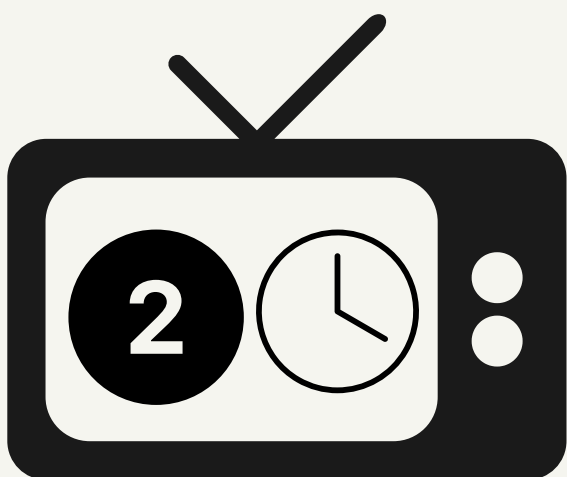
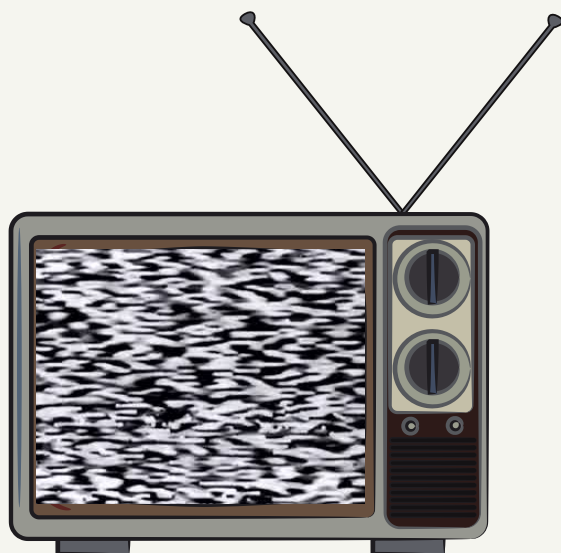
Life was very different.

But most people didn't have a television at home.

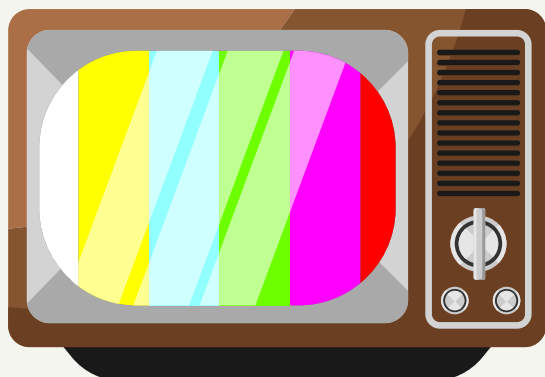
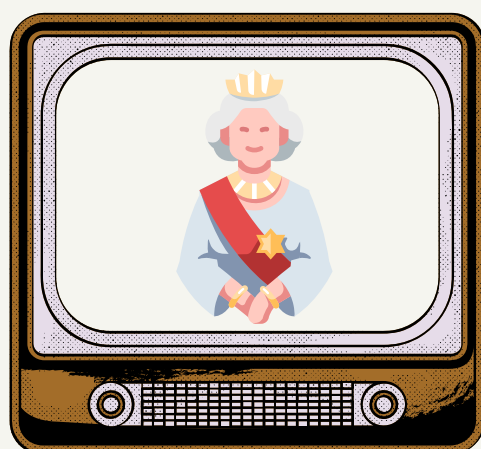
TV wasn't popular.

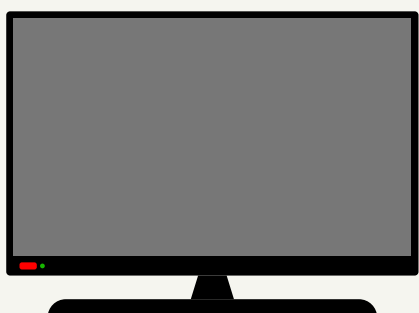
TV PROGRAMMES IN COLOR
